Digging In

Background

- Read Numbers 13:16-33. In what way was the report of Joshua and Caleb like that of the other ten spies? In what way was it different?
- What accounts for the difference? Why were Caleb and Joshua willing to enter the Promised Land while the 10 spies wanted to go back to Egypt?



Caleb's Inheritance

1. **Read Joshua 14:6-15.** Several times Caleb is described as one who *followed the LORD wholeheartedly* (vv. 8,9,14). Why do you think Caleb is described in this way?
2. In your own words, what does it mean to *follow the Lord wholeheartedly*?
3. Even at 85 years of age, Caleb was ready to take on new and difficult challenges (v.12). Why do you think that was?
4. What do you think would have happened if Caleb had allowed the Anakites to continue in the land alongside the Israelites?
5. **Read Hebrews 12:1-2.** Write down the three "let us" commands in these verses.
6. How are the first and second exhortations related?
7. How are the second and third exhortations related?

- What is one specific area of your life in which you'd like to see God work next year?
- What is one way in which you would like to serve God more wholeheartedly this new year?
- Is there a step of faith that you need to take?
- Is there a "giant" that you need to slay? An enemy outpost – a behavior or sin that is keeping you from flourishing in your Christian life?
