Getting Started

Why did God save us? Write down three purposes for our salvation.

Digging In

1. **Read Titus 2:1-10.** Write a brief summary of Paul's teaching in these verses.
2. **Read Titus 2:11-14.** Notice that v. 11 begins with the word *for*. What is the connection between vss. 11-14 and the preceding verses?
3. On what basis does God provide salvation? (v. 11)
4. What are the expected results of experiencing God's grace? (vss. 12-13)
5. Give an example of saying "No" to *ungodliness and worldly passions*. (v. 12)
6. What does it look like to *live self-controlled, upright and godly lives in this present age*?
7. How is v. 13 a strong statement of the deity of Christ?
8. According to v. 14, why did Jesus redeem us?
9. Give an example of being *eager to do what is good*.
10. In what ways does this verse show that Jesus redeemed us not just to be holy individuals, but to be his holy people?



Getting Personal

- Write a personalized paraphrase of vss. 11-14. E.g., *God's grace has appeared to me. It teaches me*
- In what ways are you already pursuing godliness – as an individual, and with others in the body of Christ?
- What is one new step you think God would like you to take?
