3. What would it look like to obey the commands of verse 7 in our world today?
4. **Read Matthew 28:18-20.** How can we apply this to shepherding our families, to help overcome distractions?
5. **Read John 21:15-17.** How does Jesus use this painful exchange with Peter to provide hope and encouragement? How can faulty family shepherds look to Him for similar encouragement?
